# **Libraries of Things**

Libraries of tools and other items

- Barshaw Tool Library. <u>Friends of Barshaw Park</u>, Paisley. To borrow garden tools for free, join the <u>Tool Library</u> as a member.
- Howwood Hire Hub. Friends of Howwood Park. A Tool Library for Howwood residents.
- Renfrewshire Libraries. OneRen operate 12 libraries in Bishopton, Foxbar, Lochwinnoch, Bridge of Weir, Glenburn, Paisley Central, Erskine, Johnstone, Ralston, Ferguslie, Linwood and Renfrew offering book lending, digital suites, activities, areas for children, and Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) recycling banks.
- Lend & Mend Hubs. Some <u>Scottish Libraries</u> offer free use of sewing machines, overlockers and hand sewing and embroidery equipment. The closest participating libraries are Kilbirnie Library, North Ayrshire, and <u>South West Library Greenock</u>, <u>Inverclyde</u>.

If it's not practical to repair, upcycle or reduce an item, dispose of it safely in the correct bin or at the Recycling Centre.

# What can go in your bins and rubbish sacks?

Renfrewshire Council's website has the most up-to-date information.

- **Grey bin:** Your grey bin is for rubbish that cannot be recycled, also called 'general waste'. If you have clinical / medical waste, do not put it in your grey bin. Email us at mybins@renfrewshire.gov.uk or phone us on 0300 300 0300 to discuss your options.
- Blue bin: Your blue bin is for paper and cardboard.
- Green bin: Your green bin is for plastics, cans, and glass.
- Brown bin: Your brown bin is for garden waste and food waste.
